Sermon Notes

David & Goliath

Hebrew Word *ḥê·raḇ·tî* = to defy, to mock, to deride.
This word occurs six times in this story – vv.10, 25, 26
(twice), 36, 45.

Thought for the Week

David goes against Goliath, not to display the courage of a young man but to fulfill the role of God's anointed. He had already been anointed by Samuel. For that reason, he cannot endure the blasphemies of Goliath. He describes Goliath's awesome armor, but says, "I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel" (1 Sam. 17:45). What David exhibits is faith. The author of Hebrews gives his roster of the men and women of faith in the Old Testament (Hebrews 11). Faith and grace go together. David as the Lord's anointed is a type of Jesus Christ, the Messiah, who meets and conquers Satan the strong man so that he may deliver those who are Satan's captives (Luke 11).
