Sermon Notes

Thought for the Week

The speaker's great sin against her daughter was that she didn't reach her daughter's conscience. In fact, she didn't even try. She felt that if she worked on her daughter's outward behavior, it would work inward. But true life change never works that way...The speaker concluded that her real sin against her daughter was her attempt to control her outward behavior. She was not really able to connect with her daughter until the Holy Spirit brought her to a deeper conviction of sin in her own life. Only after she was broken herself, could her daughter begin to hear her. Most parents are willing to say, "I'm sorry I got angry." However, it is when our own hearts are truly broken before God, that our kids hear what we are saying. Kids need to know that Mom and Dad are the biggest sinners in the house who desperately need Jesus, just as much as they do. So we reach our children and others through our brokenness, weakness, and repentance – not through pounding the law into them.
