

Intro

- The author uses "by faith" 18 times in Chapter 11
- Sandwiched between two chapters of endurance (10, 12), there is a whole chapter dedicated to faith (11)

Definitions of Faith in our Culture

- 1. Positive outlook on life
- 2. Naively believing something

Verse 1

Scriptural Definition of Faith

- 1. Faith is the substance of things hoped for, and the evidence/conviction of things unseen.
- The things hoped for are God's promises to us; all the spiritual blessings that we will receive in their fullness in glory
- Faith in hope in Scripture, are almost synonymous
- Faith lays hold of what is promised, as something real and solid, although yet unseen.

Verse 2

• By faith, all who were saved in the Old Testament received their commendation/award

Verse 3

 Although there is evidence that there is a Creator, we ultimately have to trust God since we were not there

Verse 4

- · Cain came with faith as he gave his sacrifice to God
 - He was commended as righteous through this sacrifice (see verse 2)
- Cain still speaks today

Verse 5

Enoch, by faith walked with the Lord. God approved of him, and ∴ took him

Verse 6

• It is impossible to please God with anything we do without faith.

Verse 7

- Of all the millions or billions of people, only one man (Noah) believed, and through this faith he condemned the world.
 - One way he condemned the world because God promised not to wipe out humanity permanently, and he was a single vessel God used to keep the human race alive
 - Every nail that went into the boat, was Noah communicating to the world, through action, that they have no excuse for their unbelief
 - Actions of Faith either are/can be used to convert, or to condemn

Application

1. Cling to God's promises as if we have already received them
